



The Pondalian Route

The Val Nativo Pondalian route is a tribute to the Ponteceso native son and poet Eduardo Pondal is aimed at sharing information about his life and works while at the same time contributing to boosting tourism in the municipality of Ponteceso and along the Costa da Morte.

This nature route starts off at O Recheo Square, site of the memorial dedicated in 1981, and continues to the fourteen monoliths that mark significant places in the work of the author of the Galician anthem. This four-kilometre return trip path borders the banks of the River Anllóns – where the river's water meets the sea – crosses the green, productive valley and ascends up to the summit of Mount Branco.

The monoliths – four of them two metres tall with the other ten each measuring a metre – will be the stony guides of the path of the hiker or the cyclist. Part of the route may also be done in a car, with a short bypass.
